INTRODUCTION

Shortly before her death in September 1962, when she was accidentally killed in Italy, Elizabeth West wrote an introduction for use in theatre programmes. These ideas in which she believed, and for which she strove ceaselessly and without compromise during the first five years of the Company's life, are still the backbone of our policy today, and I can give no better introduction to this Company than to reproduce below this statement.

PETER DARRELL

Ballet is a conglomeration of music, painting, movement and ideas. The ideas are shaped by the choreographer or producer, who attempts cohesion of all the elements into fused series of pictures expressed through the personality and technique of the dancers he has chosen.

For the enjoyment of ballet, as with music and painting, knowledge of the technique is unnecessary, and indeed often fogs up the main issue—whether or not the programme as a whole gives pleasure and provokes reflection.

Most programmes consist of several ballets, and directors aim at a juxtaposition of contrasting parts so that the whole is a satisfying balance. This is difficult as no two people watching a programme will see it in exactly the same way, but when the curtain falls they will know if a work has given them pleasure; they may not like or understand a ballet, but yet admire the dexterity and conviction with which it has been performed.

Our programmes do not rely on 'classical' ballets, or familiar music, but ask of the audience a spirit of adventure. We hope that you will be moved, stimulated and amused, for these are the ingredients of theatre at which we aim.
